Question 2: Now, in your own words, write down the definition of a noun and give me two examples. Hint: Think of where you went today and what food you had to eat.




Question 3: Which of these is not a verb?

Question 5: By the way, this is what Jack was eating. Is this a proper noun or a common noun?




- a) Proper noun
